2010 Junior Lancers Joker's Wild Tournament Rules (4 Game Guarantee)

It is the intent of O.M.A.H.A. and the Junior Lancers to provide a fun and competitive tournament for all participants and spectators. Good Sportsmanship is expected of all participants. Improper and abusive behavior will not be tolerated! It is the responsibility of each coach/manager to control his/her team and exemplify good sportsmanship.

Before and After the Games:

1. Team managers must check-in 1 hour prior to first scheduled game and present USA Hockey credentials. We will be checking rosters, Consent to Treat forms for all players as well as coaches, and USA Hockey Code of Conduct forms.
2. The home team will wear light jerseys. If the team does not have two sets of jerseys, it is the team manager's responsibility to notify the opponent and referees of any change prior to game time.
3. The only persons allowed on the benches are eligible players in uniform and a maximum of **four registered team officials.**
4. All players must wear all required equipment as approved by USA Hockey. **All players must wear mouth guards while on ice.**
5. Teams must be prepared to start 15 minutes before scheduled game time unless notified by the Tournament Director.
6. At the conclusion of each game, the coach or manager of each team shall be responsible for reviewing the score sheet (front and back) to determine whether any player or team official has been suspended or disqualified for participating in any future game or games. **The Tournament Committee will not overrule any on ice decisions (playing rules). No hearings will be held for game misconduct penalties.** The Grievance Committee will be considered the proper authority for any player or team official receiving a match penalty and will make a ruling regarding the continued participation of a player or team official in the tournament. All findings from any match penalty will be forwarded to the team's local governing body at the conclusion of the tournament.

All tournament games will be played under USA Hockey rules with the following exceptions:

1. **Game Times:**

- a. Each game will consist of three 15 minute stop-time periods:
- b. Each team will be allowed one 60 second time out per game to be used at their discretion during regulation game play (Not to be used in overtime situations).
- c. Teams will be allowed a three-minute warm-up period prior to each game and a one-minute break between periods. The ice will be resurfaced between periods 2-3.
- d. The Tournament Director or a representative of the Director, after consultation with the referee, may cancel any game in progress in any instance where he/she believes it necessary to protect the welfare of players or officials. In the event of such cancellation, the Tournament Director, or a designated representative, shall determine the result of the game for tournament standings.

2. **Team Standings and Tie Breaking Rules:**

- a. Two (2) points will be given for each win. One (1) point will be given for each tie. Zero (0) points will be given for a loss.
- b. Total points for each team will determine final positions in each division. The two teams with the highest total number of points will qualify for the championship game. *Division A highest number of points = Championship Game and Division B highest number of points = Championship Game.*
- c. If two or more teams have an equal number of points, their position in the standings will be determined by the result of games played by the team in the following order:
 - i. The points acquired in head-to-head games.
 - ii. Lowest goals against.
 - iii. The team with the fewest penalty minutes for all games played (game misconduct = 10 minutes).
 - iv. Quickest goal scored in a game.
 - v. Coin toss (each team represented at toss)

3. **Overtime:**

In the event of a tie at the end of regulation play in the **championship game**: A two minute rest period will be allowed after which sudden death overtime will be played under the following rules:

- a. The teams will not change ends.
- b. Play will resume in a 5 minute stop-time period until terminated by a goal.
- c. If still tied after the end of the overtime, a shoot-out in accordance with USA Hockey Annual Guide will take place.
